

Annotation Instruction—class 1

An annotation is a summary and/or evaluation of each source. In this case you will summarize each lecture and links posted to the website.

Sometimes the links will be articles, sometimes videos.

While some annotations include assessment and reflection, **for this class simply summarize the important points.**

Summarize: In these annotations you merely summarize the source. What are the main arguments? What is the point of this lecture, article, video? What topics are covered? If someone asked what this article/lecture is about, what would you say?

The length of your annotations will determine how detailed your summary is.
