- 2. List 4-6 of the most important points in the lecture.

3. Write one or two sentences stating the most important or interesting thing you learned this week.

Sometimes you will also have video links to view. These will follow the same format as the lecture. Here is your grading rubric for the weekly lecture (and video if we have one).
