The Capitoline Venus, Roman copy thought to be based on a Greek original (probably by Praxiteles 2nd or 3rd century) Marble, c. 6'3"

- 1. Identify each as to title, time period, culture, belief system, context, etc. if known.
- 2. Describe very carefully. I mean this. First just say what you are looking at.
- 3. Infer or discuss meaning. Is there a story, or a myth? Tell it.
- 4. How can we identify the figures? Who are they? How do we know?
- 5. What are some of the reasons each was made? This has to do with their context, the time they were made.

Do this part for each one.

Then, compare and contrast. How are they similar? How are they different? Why?

Write at least three complete pages. 12 point type 1.5 spaced. Include all resources consulted. This means you will tell where you got the information you are including in your analysis. You will need to use the images as a source, then find the answers to the questions in other places.
